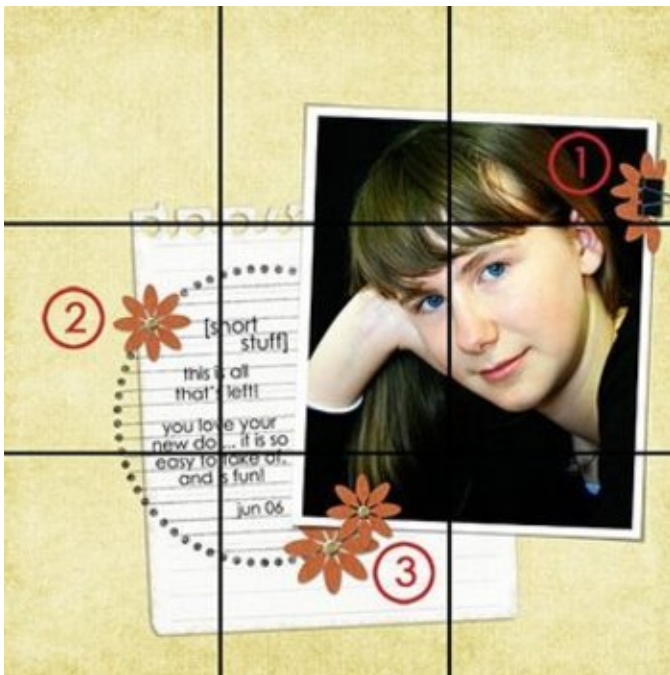


Visual triangle and grid

My scrapping style is predominantly simple, incorporating lots of white space. I almost always use two 'visual aids' when creating a page ... a grid that I use to help position my photos, and the '**visual triangle**' principle.

Grid: I imagine a three by three grid is on top of my page, and place the eyes of my subject in my photo, or point of interest in my photo, over one of the intersections.

Visual triangle: my visual triangle ties my page together. You can see that there are three flowers on my page that make up an imaginary triangle. This creates a virtual boundary for the viewer's eye, linking all the layout elements together, and creating a feeling of 'organized space' on the page.



You can see that Natasha's eyes are close to the intersection of the top right corner part of the grid.
